Hands, Face, Space	Participants, staff and volunteers are reminded to follow the 'Hands, Face, Space' rule during the event.

	Space – stay 2 metres apart from people you do not live with where possible, or 1 metre with extra precautions in place (such as wearing face coverings)		
Major & Minor Medical Issue(s)	First Aid will be provided by a Trinity First Aider (Michelle Martin) who is participating in the walk.		
Minimising contact	All items to be given to participants such as drinks should be provided in a contact free manner. Items should be laid out on a table for the participant to collect themselves. Staff & Volunteers advised NOT to pass items to avoid direct contact.		
NHS Test and Trace	All participant details including contact numbers for the lead event booker will be obtained via the online entry system prior to the event. A list of staff, volunteers and suppliers working the event will be maintained. These details are kept on file and can be contacted should there be a requirement to through NHS test and trace.		
	Please note: Trinity Hospice cannot be responsible for obtaining the contact details of the 'general public' whom may be in proximity to the route, as the route is open to the public.		

The above risk assessment summary outlines the potential hazards, risks and control measures in place at the event with regards to COVID-19.

Whilst Trinity Hospice will endeavour to create a COVID-Secure Event Environment; implementing all reasonably practicable measures to keep participants, staff and volunteers safe. There remains a significant risk of COVID-19 within the community.
