Trinity Bereavement Walk- Terms and Conditions

Please read the following terms and conditions before entering. By participating in the Bereavement Walk you are agreeing to the terms and conditions.

REGISTRATION

- 1. Participants must submit an official registration form.
- 2. On the day sign-up may not be permitted.
- 3. Everyone is welcome to take part in the walk. Any participants under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a responsible adult, who has also registered for the event. Any dogs must be on leads and may come on the walk but will not be permitted to enter the Linden Centre for refreshments.

EVENT DETAILS

- 1. The walk will start at 10:30pm on Thursday 9th December 2021, meeting on the pavement at the side of the Linden Centre car park entrance. The walk is approximately 5km and will take approximately 1 hour. Outdoor hot drinks will be provided after the walk for 30 minutes. We reserve the right to impose a cut off time, to allow the site to be cleared of participants, equipment and litter.
- 2. The event will be controlled by a number of marshals. For the safety of yourself, other participants and the spectators, please abide by any instructions issued by the marshals.
- 3. It is essential that you advise us of any medical conditions prior to your participation in the walk.

YOUR SAFETY

- 1. For your safety and enjoyment of the event, we ask that you follow and adhere to the instructions given by the event organisers and event marshals.
- 2. Dogs are welcome at the event. All dogs MUST be kept on a lease at all times and you are responsible for cleaning up after your dog.
- 3. Trinity Bereavement Walk involves a level of sustained physical activity walking along pavements, footpaths and some grass so may be muddy in places. Participants make the decision to take part and must be satisfied that this activity is suitable for them as individuals. Neither Trinity Hospice nor its affiliates can be held accountable for aggravation to illness or injury sustained due to participation in this activity. Participants are recommended to seek advice from their medical practitioner prior to taking part in this event, and make provisions to ensure their safe participation. There will be a first aider accompanying us on the walk.
- 4. We strongly advise that all participants wear appropriate footwear to ensure their safe and enjoyable participation.
- 5. Participants are asked to come equipped with whatever necessary clothing, medication and nourishment is required to enable enjoyable and safe participation in this activity.
- 6. We aim to ensure the commencement of the event, however should a decision be necessary to postpone or cancel the event, participants are encouraged to look out for updates via Trinity Hospice social media channels.

- 7. Should alterations to the planned activity be necessary to ensure safety of our participants, we will give prior notice either before the event or on arrival to the event of any alterations made.
- 8. Alcohol is not permitted at the event. Trinity Hospice reserves the right to disqualify anyone who is under the influence of alcohol, whether consumed prior to commencement or during the event. This is done in order to prevent risk to the safety and enjoyment of yourself and others.

COVID - 19

- 1. The Trinity Bereavement Walk will take place only if Government and local Covid-19 restrictions allow.
- 2. Entries are open in the anticipation that by the event date; Covid-19 restrictions will have been reduced to allow the event to proceed as anticipated.
- 3. Trinity Hospice commits to delivering a COVID-Secure Event Environment; implementing all reasonably practicable measures to keep participants, staff and volunteers safe.
- 4. Participants must ensure they are following current UK government guidelines during the event in respects to COVID-19.
- 5. Participants should NOT attend the event if they are showing any symptoms of COVID-19 or are required to Self-Isolate for any reason under NHS guidance: When to self-isolate and what to do Coronavirus (COVID-19) NHS (www.nhs.uk)
- 6. Trinity Hospice reserves the right to cancel or postpone the event due to circumstances out of our control in relation to the Covid-19 pandemic.
